The ground-breaking, wave-making Newfoundland and Labrador Deaf Choir is based in St. John's, Newfoundland and Labrador. Composed of people from the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community, the Choir's mission is to make music while teaching Deaf Awareness and showcasing the beautiful visual voice of the Deaf community through song.

Blending the best of music, theatre, and dance, the Choir offers audiences a unique performance of music delivered in American Sign Language. Creating connection through art at the intersection of sign language and emotion, the Newfoundland and Labrador Deaf Choir shares with audiences a reminder of what's possible 'outside our bubbles', while proudly showcasing the deep artistry of our local Deaf community.

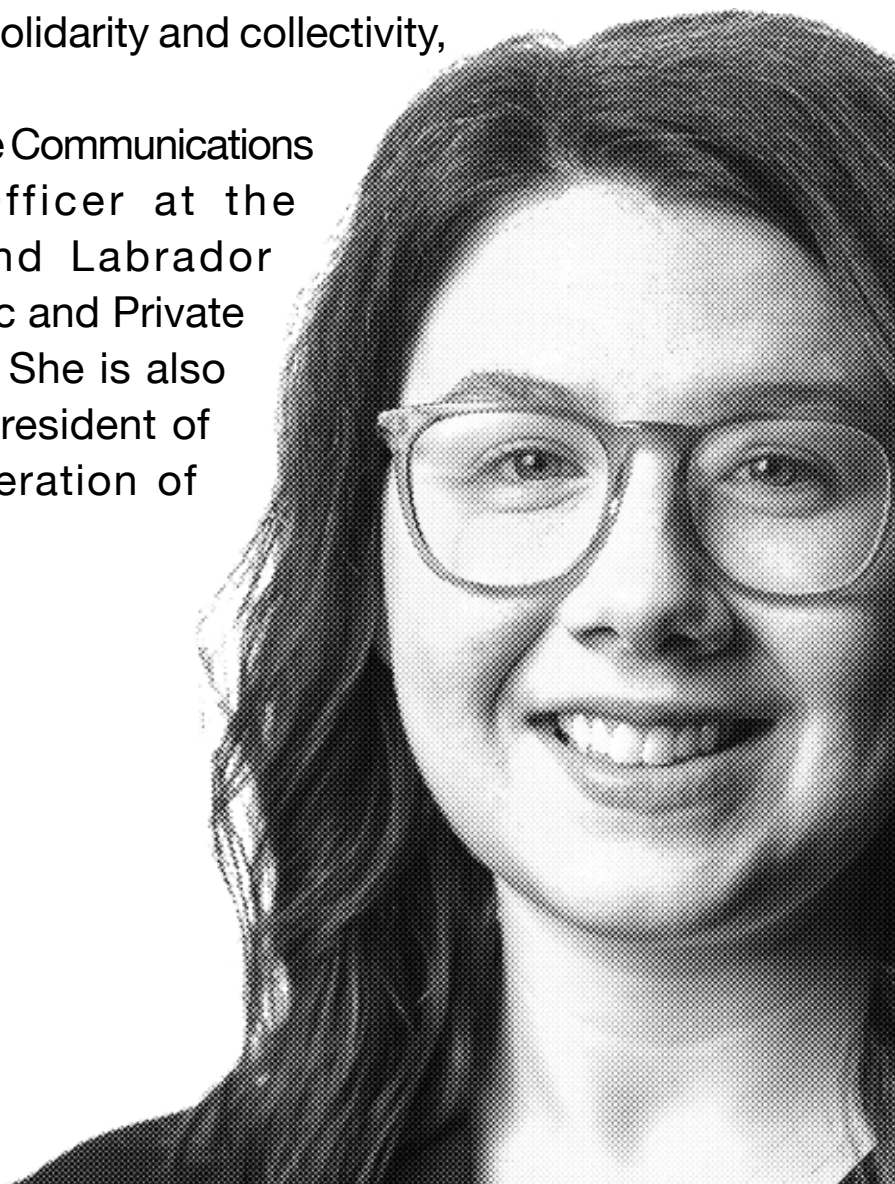
Jessica McCormick
